School Mass Info

Parents,

We absolutely love when parents join us and our students for Mass. To celebrate with your child as a part of the larger school community is such a gift. This year, there is a change that you need to be aware of if you plan to join us for a school Mass.

This year during school masses, the church will be locked to prevent access from the outside. At the conclusion of the opening hymn (at ~8:45, roughly 5 minutes after the start of Mass) all doors will be locked. The middle side doors and front side doors are equipped with push-bars to allow people to exit if necessary while still restricting access from the outside. Please do not knock to try to gain entrance, as the doors are too far from pews to hear it. If there is an emergency, contact the school office.

While we love the idea of an open church and school community, leaving the church open during school mass is no longer an option due to the heartbreaking events that are now all too frequent across our country. We thank you for your cooperation and understanding with this implementation process.

Recreational teams are again available from 2nd through 8th grade, at a cost of \$100 for the season.

There will also be tryouts for competitive teams in the 7th and 8th grades, at a cost of \$140 for the season.

New this year, we are offering additional basketball training weekly through our partnership with Griffin Elite. These training sessions will be held weekly on Tuesday evenings and include 30 minutes of skill development and 30 minutes of physical training. These sessions are in addition to the standard weekly practice time for all recreational teams. The cost of these sessions will be \$120 per child and reflect a discounted price available only to BSS students for paying full up front. Month-to-month options are also available, but would have to be arranged directly through Griffin. More information for these sessions can be obtained here.
