Good afternoon parents,

We wanted to send an update and action plan concerning the Coronavirus (COVID-19). The virus is still relatively new and there are many unknowns. We want to communicate our preparation efforts and plan for the unknown still to come. According to the Kentucky Health Department, there were no confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Northern Kentucky as of yesterday. We are closely monitoring information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and local and state Health Departments. We have also been in communication with the Diocese, local Catholic schools, and local public school districts to ensure as much continuity as possible.

The CDC reports that the spread of the virus occurs through person-to-person respiratory transmission. The following points of emphasis are being stressed here at school to help prevent the spread of this and all respiratory viruses:

1. Teachers are making sure that their classroom procedures include consistent handwashing before students eat lunch or snack
2. Alcohol-based hand sanitizer is located in every classroom, in the cafeteria, and in the office
3. The staff is continuing to clean meticulously using approved and effective cleaners
4. We continue to stress to students to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and/or mouth

Precautions taken by parents can include:

1. Reiterating the importance of frequent hand washing with soap and water as well as keeping hands away from eyes/nose/mouth
2. Strictly adhering to the no symptom policy in our handbook. Students with a fever or symptoms such as persistent coughing, vomiting, diarrhea, etc. should not attend school until they are symptom free for 24 hours
3. Encourage use of individual water bottles and the bottle fillers on our water fountains. This will reduce common contact with water fountains. The bottle fillers are hands free and are a better practice than drinking directly out of the fountain. We are also taking care to clean the water fountains, as well.

If the need should arise, a decision to close school would be made taking into consideration multiple factors including communication with local health agencies, communication with our public school district, and communication with our Diocese and local Catholic schools.

Luckily, we have used zero snow/calamity days this school year, so we have those days available should we need to close. If an extended closure (past our allotted calamity days) is necessary, all grade levels have developed contingency plans which would be communicated to their grade-level parents via e-mail at that time. While we do not anticipate it getting to that point, we want to ensure we are prepared. If the need should arise, it is the parent and student's responsibility to complete all assigned work.


If your family is considering traveling during this long weekend or Spring Break, especially to an area with a high rate of infection, please consider keeping your student home for several days after your trip to monitor for any symptoms that may emerge.

Attached to this e-mail is the flyer that Kenton County schools shared. Please reference that flyer and the links within for more information.

Thank you for your partnership in keeping everyone as healthy as possible. As always, the health and safety of our students and staff remain our number one priority. We will continue to communicate pertinent information as the situation develops.

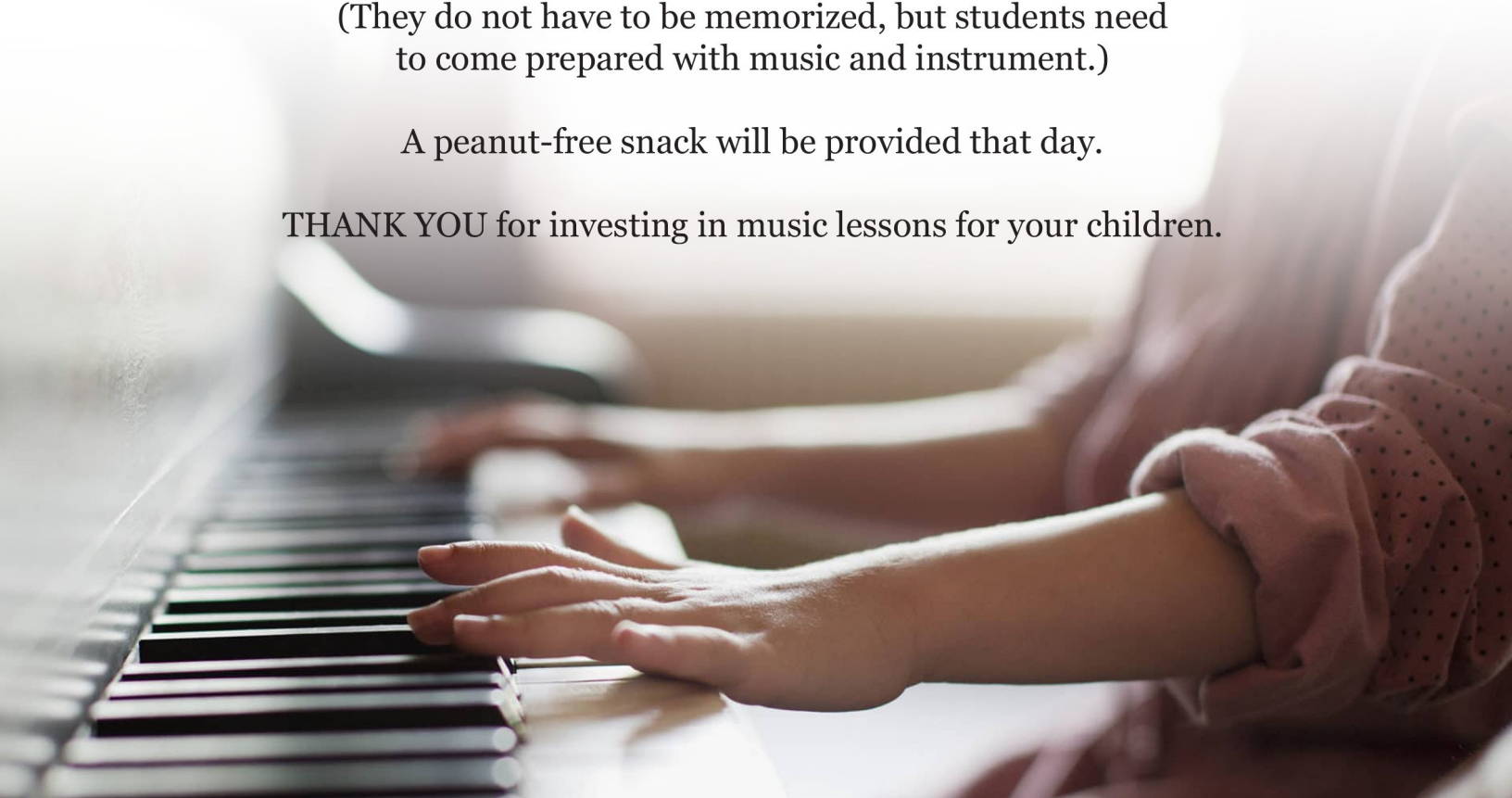
