



# Happy New Year!

#### **How to Bless Your Home for Epiphany**

Epiphany is celebrated on January 6th or the nearest Sunday, which is this weekend.

The bible reference to the magi says they entered the home where the Holy Family was staying in order to worship the Christ child there. Blessing the home is a time-honored tradition on the Feast of the Epiphany. You can find an Epiphany blessing for your home in <u>Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers</u> or at the USCCB website.

A simple form of the Epiphany blessing involves using blessed chalk to write the letters C, M, and B, plus the year, above the main entrance to the home (or above the door to each room in the house), like so: 20 + C + M + B + 23. The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also represent the Latin words Christus mansionem benedicat, which means: "May Christ bless the house." The + represents the cross.

Look for blessed chalk near the church doors this weekend, and take a piece home to bless your house. Happy Epiphany.
