A Note From Your Administration

Hi, parents,

Happy New Year to you and your families! We are excited to see what 2022 has in store for BSS! As we continue to celebrate our fourth Blue Ribbon Award, we are confident the new year will bring continued success to our school community. Thank you for the blessings you were to us during 2021.

Our Annual Giving Campaign continues to be underway. For those of you new to our community, the AGC is our main fundraiser throughout the year to help supplement the costs of specialists' salaries, improve our facilities, update and fund new technology, purchase the newest physical and cyber security to keep our students safe, and more. Tuition alone does not cover the expense of educating a child at Blessed Sacrament, and we have achieved four National Blue Ribbon Awards largely thanks to the generosity of our community which supplements the cost it takes to keep BSS so competitive. Donating to the AGC is instrumental in our success.

At the beginning of this year, we were fortunate enough to be recipients of a grant as a result of Covid-relief funds being made available to applying schools. These funds are called EANS (Emergency Assistance to Non-Public Schools). These funds did not replace last year's AGC donations. They were earmarked for approved expenses directly related to pandemic-related learning loss. We were not given a lump sum of money, and the particularities of what we are able to request are very detailed and strict. Using these funds, we were able to:


- □ hire additional teachers' aides and tutors throughout the building to assist with small-group and one-on-one intervention in grades K-8 to ensure students are on-track with where they should be after unconventional schooling the past few years
- D purchase new remedial supports for phonics, math, speech, fluency, and reading
- □ accelerate the timeline of additional technology purchases (such as Clevertouch Panels for every elementary room (K 5) and updated student devices for numerous grades)
- purchase cleaning and sanitizing equipment, solutions, and purifiers to help prevent the spread of Covid-19 in the building
- D provide teachers with professional development training for intervention strategies and programs
- update some of the technology available to teachers
- purchase resources such as microphones, webcams, and document projectors to assist with non-traditional instruction when it was needed

The AGC allows us to address a wide range of needs, not just those necessitated by the pandemic. Our Annual Giving Campaign replaces fundraisers such as candy/wrapping paper sales and walk-a-thons. This yearly donation consistently keeps our staff competitive as we are able to employ highly-skilled specialists in reading, math, speech, and intervention. Without the contributions of our community raised from the AGC, yearly upgrades to our curriculum, technology, building, and security would not be possible.

Thank you to those who have contributed to this year's Annual Giving Campaign. We are very grateful for your support. If you have not yet contributed, we ask you to prayerfully consider. Donations can be made <u>here</u>. Every donation, no matter the amount, helps keep BSS the very best for all of our students! We are continuously a Blue Ribbon School because of our community!

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL GOVERNORS CUP TRYOUTS – GRADES 4/5

TUESDAY, JAN. 11 AND WEDNESDAY, JAN. 12 2:15-3:00pm AT SCHOOL

Elementary School Governors Cup Competition is an academic event designed to provide a competitive opportunity for Kentucky's fourth and fifth graders. Students compete in quick recall, written assessment, and composition. This year students will be trying out for written assessment and composition on 2 days after school. You may come either day or both days. Students wishing to try out for written assessment will take a multiple choice test in one or more areas consisting of math, social studies, language arts, science, and arts and humanities. If your child wishes to try out for the composition portion of the contest, a prompt will be given for the composition portion in which students will write a persuasive piece. The top three students in each area will be selected to compete.

** Please make a note of competition dates so there are no conflicts with personal trips, ball games, etc.

Competition dates:

- **Districts:** Composition (Tuesday,Feb 8) Written assessments (Saturday, Feb.12)
- **Regionals:** Only those who place in the top 5 at districts will move on to regionals Composition (Monday, Feb., 28) Written assessments (Saturday, March, 5)

There are NO state finals for elementary school.


