As we near the end of January, we continue to be very grateful for your unceasing support of our school community! We are reminded on an everyday basis how fortunate we are to have our BSS village. Your words of encouragement, prospective parent referrals, financial donations, volunteer hours, and surprise treats have continued to give us motivation! Thank you.

Please read below for some updates:

A.) Valentine's Day

- We plan on having parties for our students on 2/12. Mr. Steffen and Mrs. Geiman will finalize details with Parents' a. Club. Volunteers will not be needed or permitted.
- After consideration, we are allowing students to bring in Valentines for their classmates. We are asking students to bring b. in a bag/box for the collection of Valentines as well as their Valentines cards by Tuesday, 2/9. This way, the valentines will sit for at least 72 hours before teachers distribute them to the students. If any candy is included with Valentines, ensure it is pre-packaged, not homemade, and peanut free. Thank you!

B.) Updated COVID Reporting

- Cases within the school, but not within your children's grade-level, will be reported via the weekly newsletter. Close a. contact situations and cases in the grades of your children will still be reported directly via e-mail. Thank you for your understanding.
- Our quarantines continue to decrease each week thanks to your efforts and diligence as well as the protocols in place here b. at BSS! Currently, 42 students are quarantined. 3 students are quarantined because of a positive test. The remainder are guarantined because of travel or as a close contact.

C.) Car Line


- It is important that all families adhere to the written car line procedures. a.
- <u>The document detailing these procedures can be found here</u>. Two specific reminders: i. As you enter the lot from Dixie Highway stay in a single file line along the edge of the parking lot until you reach the point where the lines divide (Point C in the linked document). At that point (as long as it is after 7:05), you may choose to go left up the church driveway or straight up the back lot. When cars cut across the bottom lot, it increases the risk of a collision between a car following protocol and those crossing the lot (not following protocol).
 - ii. Unless you have direct permission from the school, no cars should be dropping students off in the front school lot in the morning. Our walkers use that lot every morning and when it's dark/dim, it is extremely dangerous to have cars moving around in that lot. Follow the regular car line procedures as detailed in the document linked above. Thanks for helping keep everyone safe and following the procedures.

The center is open from 7am until 5:45 pm, and is located close to the Ft. Wright business district and downtown Cincinnati.


