

Cost: \$80/student (cash or check made payable to Annie Ernst)

Students will work with a variety of materials throughout this camp and will complete one guided project each day for a total of 4 projects by the end of camp. Each project can be completed within the one-hour camp, and additional smaller projects will be offered to students who finish their work early. Similar projects will be completed in week one and week two, so I ask that each student only sign up for one session. This also allows for more students to have the opportunity to attend. Students can also choose to work with watercolor pencils, which combine the control of drawing with the beauty of watercolor. A peanut-free snack and drink will be provided each day.



Students can either bring something from home to incorporate into their project (printed photo, object, etc.) or can select from project options that Mrs. Ernst has available in the art room. Both zentangle and op art are methods that require patience and focus. Students will use rulers to keep their line-work precise, and will be able to choose to work in black and white or color. We will be working with Micron pens which produce excellent quality for detailed line work. This camp is only offered to rising 7th and 8th grade. A peanut-free snack and drink will be provided each day.
