A Note From Your Administration

Happy Wednesday, parents.

Earlier this week, an administrative meeting was held with Diocesan leaders, including Bishop Foys, Superintendent McGuire, and school administrators. The Diocesan Task Force is now in the process of evaluating school data and feedback. We will communicate any changes or updates if and when we receive them.

We are meeting with our school cluster (BSS, St. Agnes, St. Joseph, & St. Pius) weekly to review local trends and discuss plans of action. Our primary goal is keep kids in school and prevent quarantine situations. We believe that in-person instruction is in the best interest of every student and family in our community. We currently only have one student quarantined due to being a close contact of a family member. We do want to point out that two of our neighboring schools are experiencing large numbers of positive cases and quarantines (~10% of students). In order to avoid such situations, we continue to recommend that students wear masks. If we experience cases, mask wearing will reduce the amount of students who are deemed close contacts and thus allow them to avoid quarantine. Current Diocesan protocol allows for family choice on masking, and we will respect that choice. We simply want our community to be informed when making their decision. Additionally, exercising caution and keeping students home when they experience symptoms is extremely important. The most prevalent COVID symptom reported this time around (especially in children) is a persistent headache. Thank you for helping keep our community healthy and in-person!

We are excited to announce that Stephen Smith of 'A Wired Family' is presenting to our families, staff, and students in grades 4-8 on internet safety and digital footprints. As technology continues to evolve and more young people are exposed to social media, it is important that we continue to educate our community on how to keep our students safe with this technology and inform them about what it means to be a good digital citizen. The parent presentation is scheduled for 10/21 at 6:30 in the undercroft. Please mark your calendars. You will be so happy you attended! A special thanks to Parents' Club for providing our community with this invaluable opportunity.
