Frandparents / Special Guests Day

Grandparents Day will be celebrated at BSS on Friday, October 18, 2024. Early dismissal day. Parents please email your homeroom teacher(s) to give permission for grandparents to check the child out of homeroom for dismissal. We do have bus service that day, so if your child will take the bus home or if they are a car rider, they will return to their homeroom by 10:30 to be dismissed to the bus or car line at 11:00.

Parents, please share these details of the day with the guests who will be joining us:

Grandparents/special guests must sign out the child from each homeroom teacher and receive an orange sticker to place on the child which indicates they have been checked out.

Students attending the 7:30 Mass with Grandparents will walk over to church around 7:20 to meet their Grandparents. From there, they will go to the Undercroft for a donut and beverage, then over to school to see the classroom and visit the book fair. Students are welcome to leave after that with their Grandparents, but please let your homeroom teacher know ahead of time that this is the plan. The child must be checked out of homeroom (grandparent will be asked to sign them out) and given an orange sticker.

Grandparents attending the 8:45 Mass are encouraged to come to school at 7:45 to visit the book fair and classroom first before Mass. When Grandparents arrive they should enter school through the main entrance and proceed to the child's classroom to meet their student. Staff will be at the main entrance to direct Grandparents to their destination. An announcement will be made around 8:25 to begin walking over to church for Mass. After the 8:45 Mass, students and Grandparents will go to the Undercroft for a donut and beverage. Again, any students leaving with Grandparents MUST check out and receive a sticker from their homeroom teacher. Please remind your child as we will here at school.

Students must remain with their Grandparents at all times and not wander the school building. Please encourage good manners as we will remind students here at school as well.

Parent volunteers are expected to sign out their child from the homeroom so we can account for all students. Safety first!

Let special guests know that we have an elevator if needed.

PHYSICALLY

Fall sports are well underway. In soccer, the JV team won the Regional Tournament, and Varsity is headed to Districts with high hopes. The golf team had a successful season and is cheering on Joseph Mangine as he heads to the State Tournament. The football team is finishing the season firing on all cylinders and looks to make another run for the State Title. In cross country, many leaders have returned, and younger runners are stepping up as Coach Mosher and the athletes aim to continue their winning streak with a 4th consecutive running sport State Title (2023-24 Champs in XC, Indoor, and Outdoor Track).

ACADEMICALLY

The school year is off to a great start, with students exploring a variety of interests. STEM students have measured the weather, driven 4-wheelers, and interviewed engineers. Art students have won contests and are adding to their portfolios. Business classes are managing mock stock accounts, and English students have read classics like *To Kill a Mockingbird, Macbeth, Of Mice and Men, Frankenstein*, and more.



SOCIALLY

Braveheart Night is a beloved tradition that draws a crowd, and this year was no different, with over 200 students in attendance (and 75 on the field). Students painted their bodies, donned "kilts," and marched into "battle" to cheer on the Colonels as they defeated the Beechwood Tigers.
