## Grandparents/Special Friends Day

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION!** 

Parents, please share these details of the day with the guests who will be joining us.

- Please let your child(ren)'s homeroom teacher know how each child is going home on GP day.
   If they will go home with Grandparents or special guests, they MUST check out with their homeroom teacher and receive a sticker to prove they have checked out.

   Please remind your child of this as we will remind them at school, too. If students are bus riders or car riders at 11:00, they will return to their homeroom by 10:30am to prepare for dismissal.
- Students attending the 7:30 Mass with Grandparents will walk over to church around 7:20 to meet their Grandparents. From there, they will go to the Undercroft for a doughnut and beverage, then over to school to see the classroom and visit the book fair. Students are welcome to leave after that with their Grandparents, but please let your homeroom teacher know ahead of time that this is the plan.
- Grandparents attending the 9:00 Mass are encouraged to come to school at 8:00 to visit the book fair and classroom first before Mass. When Grandparents arrive they should enter school through the main entrance and proceed to the child's classroom to meet their student. Staff will be at the main entrance to direct Grandparents to their destination. An announcement will be made around 8:40 to begin walking over to church for Mass. After the 9:00 Mass, students and Grandparents will go to the Undercroft for a doughnut and beverage. <u>Again, any students leaving with Grandparents MUST check out and receive a sticker from their homeroom teacher.</u> Please remind your child as we will here at school.
- Students must remain with their Grandparents at all times and not wander the school building. Please encourage good manners as we will remind students here at school as well.
- Students who do not have Grandparents or Special guests visiting will remain in the homeroom throughout the morning with activities to work on. We are happy to pair your child with another family with your permission.

# From Our Parisit

### HALLOWEEN: HOLLOW OR HALLOWED

We build memorials today over the sites of tragedies, and people place mementoes of loved ones near these memorials. We meet there on the anniversaries of the events that took family and friends from us, and we remember those whom we have lost.

In the same way, the early Christians gathered on the anniversaries of the deaths of their martyred relatives and friends to remember. They did not mourn, however, but celebrated the faith and witness (translated into Greek "witness" is "martyr") of those who still remained united with them in the mystical body of Christ through the communion of saints.

In time, so many had died in witness to their faith that no one knew or could remember all their names. As we honor the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, so Christians wished to honor those unknown saints. The feast of All Saints entered the Church calendar in the 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> century, and in the 11<sup>th</sup> century, All souls Day became a popular companion to it in France. As these customs spread throughout Europe, Hallow'een (Hallows Eve) became the vigil of both remembrances.

What does all this have to do with costumes, jack-o'-lanterns, and trick or treat? Next week, we'll take a look in the great American melting pot to find out.
