We have focused on identity (SHAPE) and vocation. This year we will focus on living out that unique vocation, or purpose that God has given each of us - our mission.

We will explore how God reveals both himself and our life's mission through experience.

Good afternoon, BSS families,

As reported earlier this morning, we are seeing an increase in COVID-19 cases in NKY which subsequently impacts our school community. Most cases this school year have been a household member or close contact (not the student or staff member him/herself) testing positive.

Here are a few reminders and clarifications:

- Please avoid non-essential gatherings, particularly if they are indoors, lack proper distancing or face coverings, or involve a large number of people. It only takes one or two incidents to have a big impact on our school. This is incredibly important to practice as we approach Halloween weekend. In particular, sleepovers put many students at risk of exposure and thus, quarantine. We ask that you please practice extra caution during this time because of cases spiking. The choices that each family makes directly affects our school community.
- □ Typical timelines for return are: A) person testing positive 10 days after recovery, B) household members/close contacts testing positive 24 days after onset of symptoms (10 days of recovery, plus 14-day quarantine), & C) other potential exposure 14 days after contact.
- Please take your child to the doctor any time that he or she exhibits one of the following: A) fever,
 B) severe, prolonged, combined, or unusual symptoms. If a household member is showing symptoms or awaiting a test result, keep students home until a negative test result or alternate diagnosis is received.
- □ If you need to report a potential COVID exposure and/or test, or if you have questions about how to handle a situation, please contact the administration as quickly as possible.

Our primary goal is to keep everyone safe, healthy, and learning in person. We cannot continue to successfully learn in-person without your help. As cases spike in Kentucky and across the country, it's so important that we work together to make safe choices for all members of our school community. We appreciate your support with this!
