MAP scores will be coming home with report cards for grades K-8. We use MAP tests for progress monitoring of our students three times a year. The test adjusts to the individual student and identifies areas of strength and weakness. Teachers are then able to use these results to guide instruction in areas where the whole class might need re-teaching or review, as well as working with individual needs.

HALLOWEEN: HOLLOW OR HALLOWED - CONTINUED

As descendants of the Celts, the French, and other European nations immigrated to America and intermarried, their customs intermingled. By the 1800's, this uniquely American festival, with its Celtic bonfires and pranks, its French masquerade of saints and devils, and Middle Age European tradition of giving out sweets (soul cakes) to beggars who agreed to pray for their benefactors was a fixture, even though it was unknown in the lands in which its various customs originated.

Greeting card companies added witches and black cats in the 1800's, and amateur folklorists contributed the jack-o-lantern, an Americanized version of the turnip lanterns used in some Celtic festivals.

In the last few years, Mexico's celebration of Dia de los Muertas has added some brightly-painted skulls and other unique customs.

Sadly, some people today associate our Halloween with the occult. Keeping in mind that it all started with the memorial celebration of martyrs and a desire to pray for all the dead helps keep the hallowed in Halloween.

Skeletons and skulls remind us of our mortality and need for repentance and reconciliation. Witches and devils remind us of the evil over which Christ has triumphed. Trick-or-treaters remind us to be hospitable and generous, for we are all journeying together. Humorous epitaphs on gravestones and light-hearted "tricks" that abound on Halloween night would probably be easily understood by Saint Lawrence who kept joking, even as he was skewered and roasted alive, or Saint Francis who said, as he lay dying: "Welcome, Sister Death." An attitude of joy in our Lord turns all the trappings into a neighborhood block party. We should never allow ourselves to retreat from our celebration of Christ's victory over death because some people don't understand it and others would turn it into something evil.
