A Note From Your Administration

Dear Parents,

We are thankful and blessed that we have made it through nearly a full trimester of in-person learning! The first trimester ends next Friday, November 6th. Making it this far would not have been possible for our school community without your help. As you know, we have seen our share of COVID cases, primarily in close contacts, but in a few students as well. Thankfully, because of the caution of our parents and families, we have been able to avoid any whole-class quarantine situations. This is not the case at many other schools, so we want to thank you for your efforts and ask that you please continue this diligence into the winter, through the holidays, and throughout cold and flu season. Remember to have students dress warmly to school as we move deeper into the winter (long sleeves/leggings, uniform sweatshirts and fleeces, etc.). Also, send them with warm outerwear for recess as we will continue outdoor recess for as long as it is bearable. Maintaining fresh airflow is so important as we continue to navigate this situation. Thank you.

Car Line Updates

We want to alert you all to a change to the morning drop-off procedures. Please <u>CLICK HERE</u> for detailed information regarding car line. <u>This change will go into effect next Wednesday, November 4th</u>. Please stick to the regular procedures until that day. This change is driven by a higher-than-normal volume of cars in the morning car line. Please note that in order to keep everyone safe, it is imperative that you closely read the directives linked above concerning the use of the church driveway for morning drop-off.


The most important elements to remember are:

- A. This route **may NOT be used before 7:05** (to keep it clear for busses and morning Mass traffic)
- B. **Drop-off in the right lane only** when you are past the crosswalk so students do not cross traffic (you may pull into the left lane once all students are clear of vehicles)
- C. Even though you have a green light at the exit of the church driveway, **there are often walkers/ bikers crossing, and traffic from Pleasant Ridge** (across the street) that also have a green light. Be very cautious when pulling out.

Thank you for helping us keep students safe and also alleviate congestion of our car line.



They will distribute the books to local schools, organizations and KIDS who will read and enjoy all over again!!






