A Note From Your Administration

Happy Wednesday, parents,

As we enter into our 14th week of in-person instruction, we feel very blessed and thankful that we have not yet had to quarantine a class or grade level due to both the protocols put into place inside the building and also the diligence of our community outside of our building. That being said, there has been a concerning uptick in cases in the tristate area forcing several schools, some of which are in our Diocese, to quarantine classes, grade levels, or shut down fully for virtual instruction. There has been no evidence of spread in any Diocesan school and many of the recent cases have been linked to Halloween parties and social gatherings over that long weekend. We implore you, as we move into the holidays, to please use caution when choosing activities for your family members. These choices directly affect whether or not in-person learning can continue at BSS. To be frank, we have dodged several quarantine situations to-date and many of our closest calls were only avoided because of proactive decisions by our families. We need to continue to make good decisions outside of school and keep acting proactively if and when students experience symptoms. The combination of these two items have the most direct and drastic effect on us staying in-person.

A. Updated COVID Reporting

a. Here are the updated numbers on our current COVID-related cases and quarantines. Remember, if there was a chance of exposure inside of the building, that information will be communicated separately via a more specific e-mail. Currently, 15 students are quarantined because of exposure to positive cases or travel, 2 students are quarantined due to receiving positive test results (after being proactively quarantined), and 2 staff members are quarantined (one because of a positive test and one because of a positive household member). The only grade NOT affected by one of these situations is 5th grade. Again, we want to reiterate that these cases are all communicated to the Diocese and the details are analyzed to determine next steps, if any. None of these cases were found to have led to exposure in our building.


B. Practice Virtual (NTI) Day

- a. A practice virtual day is necessary due to the recent quarantine situations and closures of schools within our Diocese. Because of the spike in quarantine cases after the Halloween weekend, we have chosen to schedule our virtual learning day for <u>Monday, 11/30</u>. On this day, staff will be in school, but students will be at home learning virtually. This will allow students to have an extra day to quarantine before resuming instruction in the building following the Thanksgiving Holiday. We are asking that your immediate family self-quarantine after Thursday, 11/26 so that the remainder of the break (11/27, 11/28, 11/29, & 11/30 (NTI day)) can serve as a mini-quarantine period. We are asking that you limit interactions with anyone outside your immediate household to limit the amount that COVID affects our community. Please monitor yourselves and your children closely during these days and if anything unusual is detected, proactively keep them home for a few additional days.
 - i. We will be following the Monday schedule detailed on pages 8 10 of our re-opening document.
 - In grades K 3, students will meet with their homeroom teacher.
 - In grades 4 & 5, students are divided into sub groups by last name (Group A: A-K, Group B: L-Z).
 - In grades 6, 7, & 8, students are divided into groups by their leveled classes.
 - ii. All classes will be live. Teachers will communicate with students/you in advance about how to access classes.
 - iii. Student devices will be sent home on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving break if requested. If you did not request one (via parent survey) and you need one, please e-mail <u>Mr. Thomas</u>.
 - iv. Attendance will be taken & student work will count.

C. Other Reminders

- a. Parent/teacher conferences begin the week of 11/30. Signups will be sent out near the end of this week.
- b. Picture re-take day is on Tuesday, 11/17.
- c. Report cards will be published online near the end of the week of the 16th.
- d. If you are traveling outside of the tri-state area for Thanksgiving Break, please notify the office as soon as possible. As a reminder, traveling to any states near or above a 15% positivity rate as well as traveling by plane require a mandatory 14 day quarantine upon return.
 - i. If you have out-of-town guests coming to Thanksgiving, please note the positivity rate of the area from which they are traveling. If the county or state has high rates of Covid, please consider keeping your students home for a few additional days after the break.

We have had many questions about if we plan to/think it is realistic to stay in-person. We plan to stay in-person for as long as possible. The only thing that could change that is an outbreak of cases inside of our building or a mandate from higher powers. So long as our families work with us to prevent that, we are hoping to be able to avoid it. Distance learning isn't the ideal format for any student or staff member and will only be used if absolutely necessary. Please help us prevent that necessity! As always, thanks for all that you do.








