A NOTE FROM YOUR ADMINISTRATION

Dear Families and Friends,

I had the pleasure of taking a couple families on tours of Blessed Sacrament this past week. We went into the Atrium where our preschoolers were learning the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. This program is a hands-on catechism program where our students are guided by the Holy Spirit as they interact with the materials. Next year, we will be expanding this program for kindergarten as well. We were the first school in Kentucky, to our knowledge, to offer this program to our students! I know for sure we were the first in the Covington Diocese. If you are interested in learning more, please find additional information about this program farther down in the newsletter.

In walking into one of the kindergarten classrooms, they were talking about Advent, and sharing what they prayed for at home the night before. One student said they prayed for the poor. Another said they prayed for their mom because she was sick. A third said she prayed for the homeless because it was extra cold last night. We are so blessed to be able to share our faith openly here at school!

In second grade, they were diligently working in their centers. This enables them to work in small groups and rotate in the room to work. The parents on the tour were impressed with how focused and hard working our students were already in 2nd grade. Of course that's what happens when parents and educators partner for many years and our good God leads us. Thank you for all you do to reinforce learning, praying and respectful behavior at home. It shows!

I met with the Fort Mitchell Fire Chief last week. He let me know that the church is heated by radiators, so there is only warm water coming from the sides of the church. He said if there were going to be any carbon dioxide emissions, they would most likely be in the undercroft, and he still thought that was extremely unlikely. We are putting in a carbon monoxide detector in the undercroft and the church in an abundance of caution. They have done air quality testing several times now and determined the air quality is fine. We had a lovely, uneventful all school mass today.




